- Staff attended the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council's Clean Energy Coalition workgroup for a Solar 101 presentation. This presentation was developed by FlaSEIA and can be found at this link.
- Staff applied for and was accepted into the U.S. Department of Energy's <u>Clean Energy to Communities Program</u> (C2C) cohort on Implementing an On-Site Clean Energy Procurement Strategy. This is a six-month virtual training workshop in partnership with the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL). As mentioned in the program's purpose, "these peer-learning cohorts are multi-community engagements that convene to exchange strategies and best practices, learn in a collaborative environment, and workshop policies, program proposals, actions plans, and strategies to overcome challenges around a common clean energy transition topic." The cohort also provides technical assistance for local communities and projects.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES DEPARTMENT:

The Information Technology Services Department (a.k.a. "IT") assists all City departments (our customers) in responding to the needs of the citizens by enabling City employees to quickly and securely access vital information through the use of technology and technical devices such as computers and mobile tablets. The IT Services Department is dedicated to providing the highest

quality of service using the latest technology to create business partnerships, and in the development of team and individual strengths.

On-Going IT Projects:

- ERP (Enterprise Resource Program) This capital improvement project is replacing the City's current core software system that provides programs for Permitting, Code Enforcement, Inspections, Utility Billing, Work Order, Fleet Maintenance, Facility Management and Asset Management. The new ERP system will also include a "311" service where citizens can submit their own service requests, complaints and inquires. There will also be an on-line payment portal for citizens to pay utility bills or marina slip fees. In addition, the on-line permitting module will allow a contractor or citizen to request a permit, submit their documents online and pay their fees through the system without needing to visit City Hall. City staff are currently working the implementation of these new systems. The permitting system is expected to go live in November/December of 2023. The new work order system being implemented is expected to go live by March of 2024 and the new Utility Billing system is expected to go live by the end of 2024
- Fiber Cable Audit The City's has over 18 miles of its privately-owned fiber optics cabling that was installed at various stages over the past 25 years. The IT Services Department is currently performing a physical inspection of the City's entire underground fiber optics cable infrastructure to determine the condition and location of all cabling. This inspection will help determine where repairs or replacements may be required, as well as assist in the decision making for future projects. The inspection should be completed by fall of 2023.



Cybersecurity Monitoring - IT staff are currently implementing new systems and applications for the monitoring and detection of cyber intrusion threats.

Future IT Projects:

- Fiber Cabling Installation Projects IT Services is working on several major underground fiber cabling installation projects that will connect additional City-owned facilities to the City's secure voice and data network infrastructure. This project work will be implemented in phases over the next several years and will require design work, layout and installation of the miles of underground fiber cables. The purpose of this project is to connect all city facilities to the secure data network.
- Public Wi-Fi Access The City's IT Department is currently reviewing the infrastructure



needs to provide public Wi-Fi Internet in various City Parks and facilities. This project would require new underground fiber cabling installations as well as new network equipment and wireless appliances to provide free Internet coverage. This project is currently funded by the American Rescue Act Plan (ARPA). Should Commission approve the funding, initial underground cabling work can begin as early as 2023 with

public Wi-Fi being established in phases over the next several years.

New City Hall Security Cameras, Door Access Control and A/V Technologies - The new City Hall building has many new technologies that include surveillance cameras, controls for door access and conference rooms equipped with new audio & video systems. Once completed, IT Services staff and others will attend training on the administration aspect of the new systems.







Social Media

- Every time there is a storm we see spike on growth. Hurricane Idalia resulted in Facebook with over 500 new followers
- We doubled our social media engagement from last month.
- Top posts were related to sandbags and old City Hall decommissioning program.
- Twitter in July we lost followers, this month we gained over 100. It was one of our most engaged platforms during the storm with over 77k impressions. Highest ever.
- All the top posts were related to the storm.
- On Instagram, we had over 200 new followers. The main content here besides the sandbag reel was the fun Dunedin content.
- On LinkedIn, we doubled our engagement from last month. Top posts being the City Hall selfie and old City Hall.
- On DunediNEWS, we know we increased our subscribers specially during the storm as well as our SMS subscribers doubled.
- To date we have 8,221 subscribers. GovDelivery is constantly cleaning and updating our list – 205 new subscribers in August.
- We had an average of 48% open rate across all newsletters. This is without counting the 8 newsletters sent during the Tropical Storm.

Dunedin Website

For the month of August

- 56,000 users on the website in August on the graph attached there was a huge spike from about 2k per day to 7k per day during the week of the Idalia
- Many people were using mobile devices (58%, more during the hurricane)
- Hurricane information page and several news articles for the hurricane were top viewed pages
- "dunedin hurricane" was a top searched that lead to our page

For the Hurricane Idalia week:

- Average about 7k during the storm (Mon-Wed), typically we're about 2k every day
- pageviews for the week were 56k
- hurricane information page, evacuation news article, sandbag news article was our best hurricane pages for views
 - Other top pages were the services page (solid waste, library, parks, utilities), but those decreased in traffic as we began pushing people to the hurricane page – where we wanted them to go.
- top search terms that led to our page were "dunedin hurricane", "pinellas county evac...",
 "dunedin evacuation zone"
- Mobile device use spiked for this week at 63% highest we have seen
- Our main sources to feed traffic were Google, Facebook, and the enewsletters

Utilities Section

Water Treatment Plant – Design-Build

- o The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Refurbishment Project is complete with the exception of some warranty work (painting and electrical repairs) still being performed by the Design/Build contractor. The water treatment plant is producing high purity drinking water to meet all of the needs of the City.
- o Fire restoration activities continued through the month of July. Three of the four reverse osmosis skids are operational.

Lift Station #20 & #32 Rebuild Projects

- Both lift stations are undersized, prone to overflow during heavy rain events, and adjacent to waterways. The rebuild of these lift stations will be appropriately sized, provide emergency backup pumping, and reduce impacts on public waterway channels.
- LS #32 final bid package is complete, but approval from the State for the release of grant funds is pending. It is anticipated that construction cost will be greater than the engineers original estimate and will require an increased funding cap from FDEM.
- Lift Station #20 the construction contract was awarded by the Commission during their meeting of 3/21/23 and executed. Pre-construction conference held and Notice to Proceed set for 6/05/2023, however the contractor reports 1-year lead time for electrical components that most likely will extend the contract time beyond the 270 days. The contractor is submitting shop drawings and performing preliminary layout on the site.
 Wastewater Lift Stations Electrical & SCADA System Upgrades
 - This project consists of upgrades to the electrical panels and controls at the 42 of City's lift stations (LS) in the wastewater collection system. All lift stations will be networked to a new Supervisory Controls and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system with central controls located at the wastewater treatment facility.
 - o The contractor is continuing the submittal process and procurement of materials to be assembled and installed.
 - The contractor has notified the City of an additional supply chain delay of an electronic input card required for this project. However, partial deliveries of the order have continued to arrive.

Wastewater Lift Station #20 Force main Replacement

o This project will replace the aged forcemain serving Lift Station #20. The forcemain extends from Cottonwood Terrace along Solon Avenue west to CR 1 and continues south on the east side of CR-1 to the discharge into a manhole near Carefree Lane. Parallel to the portions of the forcemain replacement, the City installed a fiber optic line between the Public Services building, the new Emergency Operations Center and the Belcher Road Storage Facility.

- o The Fiber Optic project is 100% complete.
- o The contractor is submitting shop drawings and has surveyed the route for eminent underground installment of the FM. Construction starting in September.

• Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) – Electrical & SCADA System Upgrades

- This project includes the replacement of the majority of electrical equipment at the wastewater treatment facility. The industrial electrical equipment at the WWTP is more than 30 years in service, and maintenance has become difficult to perform, with parts being a challenge to acquire. Installation of this new equipment increases safety measures for operational and maintenance staff.
- Bids were received. The bid prices exceeded the Engineering Opinion of Probable Cost. FDEP has included an additional \$7.65M for the project to the FY23 SRF priority list.
- In the revised bid packages, the replacement of the process control (SCADA) system for the wastewater treatment process will be bid separate from the main electrical replacement work in an attempt to receive more favorable bid prices for both elements of the work.

• Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) – Chlorine Contact Chamber Rehabilitation & Cover

- The City intends to rehabilitate the WWTP Chlorine Contact Chamber (CCC). Tank lining will be removed and replaced. Gates and valves will be rehabilitated and replaced as necessary. Covers and solar panels were also planned to be added to CCC to improve process efficiency and future chemical costs.
- The City has contracted with a consultant to design the improvements. The initial design resulted in a construction cost estimate significantly in excess of the project budget. Staff worked with the consultant to rescope the project and materials of construction to meet both the project objectives and budget constraints. As a result of this effort, the covers and solar panels were removed from the project design and specifications to meet budget constraints. The consultant has submitted 100% plans and technical specifications.
- o The City is preparing contract documents for consideration of additional SRF funding and bidding in the near future.

Wastewater Pipe Lining & Manhole Lining Projects

- These projects provide for the installation of liners for pipelines and manholes throughout the City to reduce and prevent inflow and infiltration (I&I) of groundwater and rainwater into the City's sanitary sewer collection system, thus reducing the potential for sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) and treatment impacts at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- FY23 Lining area has been generated and has been reviewed by the City Attorney for acceptance as "Piggyback" contract work. The presented contract was denied due to policy issues. Another compliant contract for piggyback is being researched.
- Manhole Rehabilitation contract was awarded by City Commission on 9/5/23.

• Wastewater Force Main Replacements Project

- This project provides the design and installation of six (6) new PVC and/or HDPE force mains (#1, 2, 4, 10, 12A, & 17) with all valves, fittings, and appurtenances; and the abandonment of the existing force mains.
- Design of the force mains is complete all permits have been approved.

- o TLC Diversified was awarded this work during the 4/18/23 Commission Work Session by utilizing a Piggyback award to TLC's contract with Pinellas County. Preconstruction meeting held and construction is expected to commence during the Sep 2023 with the replacement of LS 1 force main along Edgewater Drive. The sidewalk through the Hubbard Linear Park will be closed from Florida Ave to Lyndhurst St during construction. Public notification underway regarding the construction.
- o TLC is also scheduled to start LS # 17 force main (Fairway Dr.) mid-September
- LS 2 & 10 force mains are being re-evaluated to minimize the impact of construction on downtown events and businesses.

• Offsite Potable Water Storage Site Valve Replacement

- This project provides for the replacement of in-ground valves, check valves, and fill valves at offsite Potable Water Storage sites.
- A site visit has been conducted with a contractor to evaluate the project.
- A quote has been provided via piggyback of a Pinellas County contract. The proposed work exceeds the existing budget. Funding opportunities are being investigated and with the project potentially being budgeted in FY24.

• WWTP 10,000 Gallon On-site Diesel Fuel Tank

- o This project provides for the replacement of the diesel fuel storage for on-site generators located at the City's WWTP. The existing tank is reaching the end of its service life and should be replaced in the near future.
- o Engineering/WWTP staff are seeking sole source procurement to address the safety, design and location characteristics / constraints and possible options.

• Wastewater Treatment Plant Outfall Piping Repair

- o The intent of this project is to improve the WWTP's outfall system's reliability, redundancy and safety.
- o The project has been awarded a Legislative Appropriation (\$400,000). Application for the grant has been submitted to FDEP.

Water Production Well Facilities (Well 1)

- This project provides for the rehabilitation of raw (potable) water wells, specifically Well #1 this fiscal year. The well, equipment and housing require rehabilitation to continue viable water production.
- o 100% design plans have been received. Bid documents are finalized for advertisement.
- o The proposed work is expected to exceed the existing budget should the project be advertised & bid. A contractor quote has been requested via "Piggyback" of a Pinellas County contract. The comparative "Piggyback" quote is being requested in an effort to meet budgets constraints.

• Raw Water Transmission Line Pigging

- o This project provides for the cleaning of 9.8 miles of the raw water transmission lines for the City's wellfield. The accumulation of scale, silt, organic matter, etc. necessitate the pigging approximately every ten years to maintain flow, reduce system contaminants and limit pipe degradation.
- A contractor quote has been received per the terms and conditions of a Pinellas County contract (piggyback). The Pinellas County contract was not deemed valid for piggyback contracting by the City attorney. Investigating other purchasing instruments to accomplish this work.

New Construction

New City Hall

- The New City Hall building houses the City's Commission, technical, financial, planning, billing, and administrative services. The new facility has already helped by streamlining City processes and making services for visitors, residents, and customers more convenient.
- City staff occupied the building in mid-March 2023 as a result of a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) which was issued to the contractor for the Administrative portions of the building.
 - The Commission Chambers were officially utilized for the first time on 6/1/23 for Budget Workshop #1; with the 6/6/23 Commission Work Session to be held next.
 - Final Punch List items have been documented by City staff, the project Architect (Harvard Jolly), as well as the contractor, as Manhattan works towards Substantial Completion.
 - The Grand Opening & Ribbon Cutting Event was held the evening of Friday, May 19, 2023; and was deemed by all in attendance to be a successful event.

Roadway Section

Santa Barbara Brick Street

- The project was awarded on February 21st. to Evolution Contractor, of Clearwater FL.
- Construction has commenced and the contractor is coordinating with impacted residents.
- Water and sewer lines have been replaced.
- Gutters and Driveway Aprons have been installed.
- o Concrete stabilizers have been installed.
- Work is approximately 60% complete.

Drainage / Interdepartmental Support

- o **Brady Drive:** DRMP, Inc., (one of the City's General Engineering Consultants [GEC] firms) previously prepared a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) to investigate elevating Brady Drive and conveyance alternatives where Jerry Branch passes under the road. The PER provided a preliminary cost estimate to improve the level of service (LOS) for Brady Dr., with staff selecting a 10-year LOS for design. The project design and permitting was assigned to DRMP, Inc., one of the City approved engineering contractors.
 - o DRMP has submitted the 100% Plans.
 - Specifications have been finalized and reviewed by the City.
 - o Bid documents are currently being prepared for September.
 - Temporary Construction Easements have been requested from two property owners. They have not responded to emails and door drop offs. Certified letters requesting their position were sent end of August. Construction will begin even without TCEs.
- Pickleball Courts: The Parks Division has directed Engineering to proceed with securing a design consultant to place Pickleball Courts at the Eagle Scout Park. The existing tennis courts will be converted to Pickleball courts. This will require an expansion of the existing surface, light and fence replacement.

- Engineering has received a proposal from Kimley-Horn, one of the City GECs. The proposal is being reviewed and if accepted a Purchase Order will processed for them to begin work. We expect to issue the PO in September.
- San Charles Drive Drainage Improvements: This drainage improvement project is slated for construction in FY23. The purpose of this project is to provide a roadway level of service (LOS), 10-year / 24-Hour, for the intersection of San Charles Drive and San Roy Drive South. The status of the project is as follows:
 - o A title search was ordered and submitted to the City in February 2022.
 - o Preparation of the construction plans is in process.
 - Plans were sent to utilities for review & comment.
 - Project has been delayed as a result of engineering vacancies.
- Santa Barbara Drive Drainage Improvements: This drainage improvement project is slated for construction in FY24. The purpose of this project is to provide a roadway level of service (LOS), 10-year / 24-Hour, for Santa Barbara Drive, from 200 feet north of San Salvador Drive to Bueno Vista Drive South (approximately 1,800 feet). The status of the project is as follows:
 - City staff is working with the architect for the property owner at 1768 Santa Barbara Drive to vacate an existing utility easement and coordinating with the property owner's surveyor to prepare a legal description for a new easement.
 - Construction plans are in preparation for the new outfall associated with the previously referenced address. This outfall will be up-sized as a part of the proposed drainage improvements for Santa Barbara Drive.
 - Preparation of the construction plans is in process.
 - Project has been delayed as a result of engineering vacancies.
- Buena Vista Drive Drainage Improvements: This drainage improvement project is slated for construction in FY24. The purpose of this project is to provide a roadway level of service (LOS), 10-year / 24-Hour, for Buena Vista Drive from Mira Vista Drive to 600 feet northeast of Mira Vista Drive.
 - o Preparation of construction plans is in process.
 - o Project has been delayed as a result of engineering vacancies.
- Gabions Drainage System Repair:
 - Pennoni Associates, Inc. is under contract (7/13/21) with the City to evaluate, prioritize and prepare construction plans for the repair of the gabions.
 - Approximately 900 ft. of gabions are to be designed and permitted for repair. The repairs proposed are located between Pinehurst Road, Jackmar Road, Patricia Avenue and Idlewild Drive South.
 - Survey by Pennoni has been completed with geotechnical testing by Tierra of the gabions and ditch.
 - 100% construction plans and environmental permit packages have been submitted, reviewed and approved by the City and regulatory agencies.
 - The bid is scheduled for September.

What is the Community Rating System (CRS)?



The Community Rating System (CRS) is a voluntary federal program started in 1990. It offers up to a 45% reduction in flood insurance premiums for people in flood zones within CRS communities. CRS uses a Class rating (similar to fire insurance) from 1 to 10. Most communities start at Class 9 or 8. Communities can improve their rating through 19 activities, which then increase residents' policy discounts. Every CRS Class improvement adds a 5% discount on flood insurance premiums for floodplain properties
