



FAST FACTS

- In Dunedin, children under the age of 16 must wear a lap belt while the golf cart is being operated.
- Yes, you CAN get a traffic citation in a golf cart. You can be ticketed for things like failure to yield, or not stopping at a light or stop sign. You can also be arrested for driving under the influence (DUI) when operating a golf cart.
- Operation of golf carts upon public sidewalks in unincorporated Pinellas County is expressly prohibited, except where authorized by the Americans with Disabilities Act or otherwise by law. Golf carts are not allowed on the Pinellas Trail.
- This card is a guide for applicable state and local law, which is subject to change. This should not be used for legal advice or as an exhaustive guide to all regulations.

GOLF CART LAWS

GOLF CART

A GOLF CART is a motor vehicle that can't go faster than 20 mph. Designated "golf cart communities" allow golf carts on specific streets. Signage indicates the legal boundaries or visit www.pinellas.gov/golf-cart-communities to view maps.

In Dunedin, the list of permissible public streets for golf cart operation is in sections 74-201 and 74-209 of the City of Dunedin's ordinances.

Golf cart drivers under the age of 18 are required to possess a valid learner's driver license or a valid driver license. Drivers over the age of 18 must have a valid government issued photo ID.

Golf carts are required to have safety equipment including efficient brakes, reliable steering apparatus, a horn, safe tires, a rearview mirror, and red reflectorized warning devices in the front and rear.

Golf carts operated between sunset and sunrise need headlights, brake lights, turn signals, and a windshield.
