



Bulk and Yard Waste Estimating Procedures

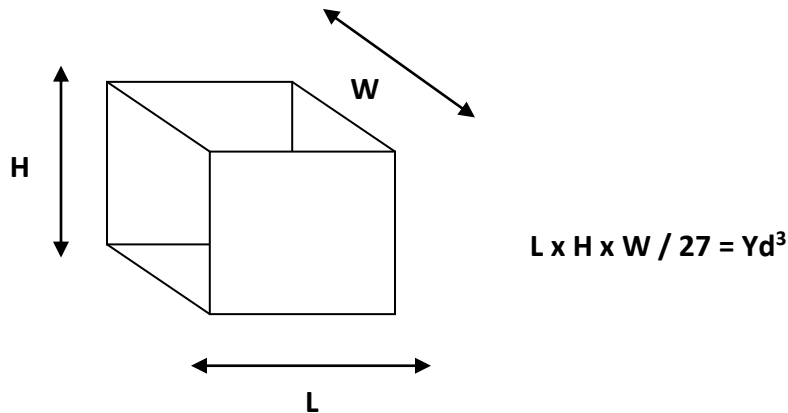
Notification for estimates will come from either route drivers radioing oversized material not meeting code, from other city departments (code enforcement, City Hall, etc.) or from customers contacting Solid Waste directly. Route drivers will notify resident by 'tag' that materials in the right of way do not meet code, requesting resident to contact Solid Waste.

Items not meeting code (Ordinance 66-61[c]) include **brush piles not tied in bundles or that are not piled neat and manageable. Bundles longer than 4 foot, bags or personal cans weighing over 50 pounds, logs greater than 4 inches in diameter, any type of building debris or dimensional lumber, or piles of material greater than 4 cubic yards** do not meeting these criteria.

Estimator will be dispatched to location to determine a price for the collection, hauling, and disposal of material placed in the right of way that does not meet code for normal everyday waste collection.

On site, estimator will measure debris pile per the following formula:

Length (feet) x Height (feet) x Width (feet) / 27 (cubic feet/cubic yard) = Total Cubic Yardage



Price will be determined based on the following schedule, rounded to the lowest, closest yardage: (For example, a 5 yard pile will be charged at the 4 yard rate)

2 cubic yards	\$79.24
4 cubic yards	\$118.86
6 cubic yards	\$158.48
8 cubic yards	\$198.10 (1/2 truck load)
20 cubic yards	\$508.56 (Full truck load)
<i>*Subject to time and materials</i>	

*Estimator will notify dispatcher of pricing and circumstances, and customer will be contacted by telephone notifying them of the rate for material cleanup (estimator making personal contact should record customers name and telephone #). If the customer is unable to be contacted via telephone, Division will dispatch violation notice via mail. Estimate will remain on file until Division is contacted by resident / customer. If after 3 attempts, customer fails to contact Solid Waste, or debris pile remains at right of way for longer than 1 weeks time without notice from resident / customer, debris pile will be collected, and property owner charged via Utility Billing system, in an effort to maintain right of ways and to protect public health and safety
